Study design, data collection procedures, and instruments seem perfect, but there are minor points that can be improved. A number of parameters have been discussed in the data and carefully analysed, but, in my opinion, it could have been statistically analysed further to validate associations between different parameters mentioned in the hypotheses. Moreover, the tables can be redesigned to summarise the data mentioned in the tables. In table 4, one of the options, S.A (Strongly Agree), is missing; instead, A (Agree) is mentioned twice mistakenly. Overall, the study has the potential to draw the attention of policymakers towards the human rights protection needed for mental health patients.
