

Review of: "Perceived Social Support as a Predictive Factor of Fatigue and Quality of Life Among Healthcare Professionals in Greece"

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Potential competing interests: No potential competing interests to declare.

1-In the abstract, it is suggested not to use qualifying adjectives, such as "alarmingly."

2-Page 1, the first sentence lacks a citation.

3-In the introduction, taking into account the studies cited, it is not clear what the cognitive contribution of the study would be, since the role that fatigue and social support have in well-being in general is part of current scientific knowledge, and particularly, health professionals.

4-It is very good that they report the Cronbach's alpha of the instruments; their factorial validity could also be reported.

5-Compliance with the parametric requirements of the data to apply Pearson's correlation is not reported; in turn, compliance with the data requirements to perform linear regressions is not reported.

6-It is suggested to emphasize the scientific contribution, not so much the intervention proposals, in the conclusion.
