

Review of: "Nigerian Youths' Perception of Privacy and their Self Disclosure on Social Media"

This interesting study has been generally well executed. It is clear about its objective. The introduction captures the essence of the study, and the author/s did a great job in providing a clear rationale and perusing the relevant literature for the study. The theoretical section was, however, a bit worrisome in that the author did not provide an in-depth discussion of the theories applied in this study. Pertinent information such as the initiators of these theories and their key assumptions was only tenuously discussed. I think this is the section that requires a bit of attention, as this will enable the author/s to juxtapose the findings against the theoretical assumptions in a more nuanced way. There were numerous instances where authors were cited without years of publication, which ought to be enclosed in brackets. Can this be corrected? Lastly, the author/s will do well to provide a more tacit intellectual explanation of why they opted for such a minimal sample for a study of this nature. I believe once these minor corrections have been done, the work will be ready for publication.

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
