Title

Add the word "Practices" in the title instead of "practice"

Literature Review

There is no need for the heading (Implicit and explicit modelling: definition); it's too general. The content of this heading may be written in the form of running text.

The table (Literature review matrix) may be removed, but if the author thinks that it is important to add it, then upgrade it to reflect the details of all variables (as currently it is focusing on the idea of implicit modelling only).

Numbering and captions of tables and figures are required.

Reword this heading "The Research" as "Purpose Statement." Besides, this heading and the research questions may be written prior to the literature review (in the introduction section).

Methodology and Participants' Selection

In the start of this section, the researcher is required to provide a brief detail about the research paradigm and research design of the qualitative approach that has been adopted for this study (as the title is reflecting that it is a case study).

References

Outdated references (prior to 2000) may be excluded, and the latest references (2020 onward) may be added to upgrade the quality of the literature review and discussion sections.
