Review of: "A Review of Transformation and Digital Literacy for the Sustainable Development in the Greater Mekong Subregion – Working Paper"

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The article *"A Review of the Transformation and Digital Literacy for Sustainable Development in the Greater Mekong Subregion – A Working Document"* explores the relationship between digital transformation, digital literacy, and sustainable development in the Greater Mekong Subregion, using visual models to enhance understanding. While it offers valuable conceptual analysis, several key issues undermine its effectiveness. The introduction lacks sufficient background context, and the structure is imbalanced—overemphasizing definitions of digital concepts while underdeveloping strategic recommendations. Additionally, the concept of sustainable development is insufficiently integrated, appearing briefly and lacking a clear linkage to digital themes. The article also falls short in analytical depth and argumentative rigor, weakening its overall impact. Revisions are recommended to improve structure, focus, and coherence.
