The article is very interesting to read. It reflects very clearly a genuine willingness and desire to contribute positively towards the rehabilitation and support of refugees; both from an academic, as well as practical perspectives. Apparently, the paper, as it stands now (in its current form), reads as a "view point" or as a "commentary" paper rather than a typical journal article that is based on a critical and comprehensive literature review and sound research methodology (methods). However, since this aspect has been clearly stated from the beginning, as the title of the paper indicates (i.e. it is based on a personal opinion and experience), then it has to be treated as a "view point" or a "commentary" paper, as I mentioned above.

In reviewing such type of papers, the reviewer has to look at the professional side/perspective more than the theoretical basis. Therefore, and after reading the article, I believe it reflects logical, achievable, meaningful and workable remarks/steps that can be taken into consideration by policy and decision makers. I have one point to address here that should be emphasized by the author in a better manner; that is the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the achievement of these goals.

Since the topic is very relevant to quality of life, mitigation of poverty and assuring equality among people, then I kindly ask the author to elaborate more explicitly on the link/relevance of the article to the SDGs and how the author's propositions can really have positive impact on the achievement/implementation of these goals, especially those that are more relevant to the study. In this way, the paper will definitely have a better professional and practical purpose, aim and social influence that can be unfolded in an organized fashion at the present and in the future.
