- (1) The abstract section is very short and does not give an overview of the subject of the study. The abstract must contain the purpose of the study, the methodology used, the sample number, and the most prominent results and recommendations.
- (2) You must review how to cite sources within the body of the paper.
- (3) The introduction and theoretical background are also short and do not have any depth that explains to the reader the research gap.
- (4) I recommend adding a literature review section and discussing studies that have attempted to study the same topic.
- (5) The Methodology section does not present the study methodology. It just shows how to use, distribute, and process the study tool. I recommend that the authors rewrite the methodology section. With the importance of mentioning the methodology used, the population and sample of the study, how to verify the validity and reliability of the study tool, and what statistical tests are used in analyzing the data. The methodology section, in its current state, is not useful at all and did not explain how to apply the study.
- (6) Tables 1 and 2 are not referred to in the results section. It is necessary to refer to the two tables mentioned previously, as well as to the rest of the tables, and to clarify the concepts and information contained in them.
- (7) The discussion and conclusion section is not helpful at all. There is no discussion of the results, and there is no link between the results of this study and the results of previous studies, and there is no depth in the analysis and discussion of the results.

The authors put a good effort into preparing this paper, but a lot of work remains to develop the paper until it is fit for publication. Good luck

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
