- Kindly include the full forms of CEDAW, BPFA, and UNDAW. As the general audience might not be aware of the abbreviations.
- Kindly rework on the Introduction from Data Presentation and Analysis. Kindly stick to policy documents and constitutional provisions (mentioned in the abstract).

Some of the pros of the paper:

- The statement of the problem is very much relevant in today's time.
- The methodology section is as straightforward as it can be. But the data analysis chapter needs to be reworked. I
 would like to suggest that the authors write a small paragraph on how they analyzed the data. If they have used any
 qualitative descriptive coding or data, they have been analyzed using software like NVIVO.
- The paper provides a fascinating insight into women's status regarding education and socio-economic and political rights.

Overall, the author has attempted a good paper. The content of the paper contributes to the existing database. With the necessary changes, the paper can be accepted for publication.
