The issues raised by the authors are fascinating and up-to-date. However, it seems that the presented case studies are presented in too general a way. The authors aimed to indicate how the use of modern technologies contributes to increasing the safety of public spaces, also in the context of combating crime. However, while the authors presented the goals of implementing various technologies based on selected examples, there is a lack of discussion of the specific effects of this action, e.g. how it affected the sense of security of residents or a decrease in the number of crimes and offences committed in public spaces.

Supplementing the article with the indicated content seems to enrich the presented content.
