

# Review of: "Assessment of Learner Satisfaction in Secondary School Education"

A good attempt on an important topic with lots of data and literature review. However, the author tries to accomplish too much without any focus. Here are the feedback and suggestions on various topics:

1. One research problem with definitions and research questions, e.g. learner satisfaction and academic performance, if possible, more focus, junior secondary and Math. use
2. Literature review is too general. E.g. higher education is not relevant. African Educational Research Journal and James Oleroch are good choices.
3. Select fewer representative sample schools with more sample students from each. The author has 15 schools with a total of 303 students, i.e. about 20 students each, difficult to generalize.
4. Research method must be clear, survey are quantitative and interviews are qualitative. The author appears to use both which is mixed methods.
5. The data appears to be suitable but the standard deviation is too high for selected items. E.g. Mean = 3 and SD = 1 means the scores can be 3 to 5 which is difficult to generalize.
6. Most important – confirm your findings with literature review.
