- 4. The literature review is not exhaustive, and there are a number of places where large statements are made without reference to the literature.
- 5. Where does the Table come from? Put the sources.
- 6. As other reviewers have said, it needs a proper methodology.
- 7. I would like to have seen some empirical research to test the assumptions, and some analysis of the different frameworks.

Having said all this, I think its core premise is interesting, if somewhat commonsense.
