This brief commentary addresses some issues with using AI in healthcare. I think most researchers in the field are aware of these issues, but with the current AI hype it is always good to highlight them.

I have some minor comments:

- line 2: "MCAT" → "Medical College Admission Test (MCAT)".
- line 7: It goes a bit too far to suggest that most medical applications (including the five references) had "inadequate training" and "limited datasets".
- line 21-23: This is called bias, in this case racial and gender bias.
- line 26-27: This is indeed the main issue: "garbage in, garbage out". Data needs to be of high quality, with appropriate metadata according to the FAIR principles, to make it suitable for AI.
