Additionally, incorporating a flow chart to summarize the PRISMA checklist and research strategy would enhance the clarity of the methodology.

Results: The results section presents a detailed account of the study selection process and characteristics of the included studies. It effectively outlines the criteria for inclusion and exclusion, providing transparency in the review process. However, it would be beneficial to include a flow diagram illustrating the study selection process as per the PRISMA guidelines.

Discussion: The discussion section offers a comprehensive synthesis of the findings, highlighting the complexity of recidivism and the multifaceted nature of its drivers. However, it falls short in providing in-depth analysis and discussion of the factors influencing the effectiveness of educational interventions. Incorporating more literature data and discussing the nuanced factors involved in successful rehabilitation would strengthen this section. Streamlining the conclusion to focus specifically on the implications drawn from the research findings would enhance its coherence.

However, improvements in specific areas such as data clarity, methodological details, and depth of discussion would enhance the overall quality and impact of the study.
