**Ethical Considerations:** Expanding slightly on ethical and data privacy concerns, and how policy can mitigate these risks, would strengthen the argument and highlight the paper's relevance to policymakers.

Overall, this is an insightful and well-written paper that makes a valuable contribution. I strongly support its publication after minor revisions.
