This article, titled "A Review of the Transformation and Digital Literacy for Sustainable Development in the Greater Mekong Subregion - A Working Document," offers an in-depth examination and analysis of the interplay and concepts between digital transformation and digital literacy, which serve as the driving forces for sustainable development in the Greater Mekong Subregion. Visual chart models are utilized to enhance clarity and readability, providing valuable insights for the future sustainable development of this region.

However, there are some issues that need to be addressed:

Firstly, the introductory section lacks a detailed background explanation.

Secondly, the article's structure is somewhat unbalanced. The analysis of concepts such as "digital intelligence" and "digital literacy," including their definitions, functions, and significance, is extensive, while effective strategies and recommendations for the region's future development are not adequately presented.

Thirdly, the article introduces the concept of "sustainable development" in its title but does not thoroughly analyze it throughout the text, only briefly touching upon it in the concluding paragraphs. The connection between "sustainable development" and the transformation and digital literacy is not clearly emphasized.

Lastly, the article lacks an in-depth process of analysis and argumentation, which results in less persuasive conclusions and a failure to address substantive issues.

Therefore, revisions can be made from these several perspectives.
