The conclusion part seems like a continuation of the materials & methods and results and discussion sections. It could be made concise and to the point, without going into details of how the variables were developed and how different measures were interpreted.

You can write just like this...

We have presented an application of quantile regression to COVID data collected in four countries, (names). The variables were classified using this and that approach. We split our analysis into parts by developing two models (give reason) and compared (why, purpose). The results were validated by this and that methods. Our results show that the model 1 fitted well to Nepal and Model 2 fitted well to overall (all 4 countries) data. The reason is that (why model 1 is better for Nepal and Model to overall.. state it). A clear difference was seen in results before and after vaccination etc..
