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This review summarises findings from a literature search about cutaneous drug reactions. Overall, the review's written English could be improved and spelling mistakes should be corrected. I do like the boxes which summarise some of the key points. However, in regard to the last box, checkpoint inhibitor therapies should be separated from other therapeutic monoclonal antibodies as they are very different in their biological effects. Given the numerous publications in the field of cutaneous drug reactions, writing a concise summary which offers a new perspective was always extremely ambitious. Unfortunately, in my opinion this review falls short on several levels. Mainly, the review is incomplete, although most cutaneous drug reactions are listed, other key ones, such as AGEP, SDRIFE, fixed drug eruptions are not, to name some. Furthermore, the review would benefit from a better structure to make it easier for the reader to identify the main points. I hope the authors find these comments helpful.

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
