I congratulate the author of the article entitled "Attitude towards entrepreneurial risk: evidence using logit models for two groups of OECD countries" for his valuable work addressing a pertinent topic: attitude towards entrepreneurial risk.

The author adequately cites concepts, bibliographic sources and references, although more recent references made in the post-COVID years may be missing. Furthermore, the literature review is included in the introduction, so it would be advisable to do it in a different section, given the importance of this topic.

The methodology of the article is well documented, although the main limitation in this part is the 2001-2016 database. If it was not feasible to use more recent data, the author should have highlighted this as a major limitation of his work.

The results are presented both descriptively and graphically through tables and graphs, however, there are graphs that are not well understood and we do not have the statistical results to verify the suitability of the commented results. The conclusions are strong, but future research plans should be mentioned to compensate for the limitations.
