Title:

In the title, Staphylococcus aureus should be written in italics.

Abstract

Background

1. Mastitis is an expensive disease. Please replace the word "expensive" by another suitable wordor rephrase the entire sentence.

Introduction

1. Mastitis has serious zoonotic potential. Please add the letter "a" before the word "serious."

Materials and Methods

Udder cleaning

- 1. 10 ml of milk was taken: Numbers at the beginning of the sentence should be written in letters (ten).
- 2. Please check for repeated sentences.



3. Why did you not use selective media for isolation of Staph. aureus such as Paired Barker medium?

Results

- 1. Molecular identification of the isolated staphylococci is necessary.
- 2. Unfortunately, I cannot judge the statistical analysis.

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
