The topic is interesting. I believe this kind of lending business is quite normal in the developing or least developing countries. It sounds similar to micro-credit scheme without legal basis. However, the author failed to provide sufficient evidences while attempting some comprehensive discussion. For instance, "The higher the loan interest rate, the more advantageous it is for the business doers. Thus, it was evident that the capital profit was the only reason that became the background for the presence of this business". Citation was not appropriately done. More importantly, author has used some non-formal word perhaps to avoid similarity issue. But it makes the article quite lethargic. Author may discuss on the basis of some relevant theories. Further, there is no indication of methods that being used. Could include some sort of techniques relate to selection of documents for review, approach in analyzing. Finally, i think the article is self-explanatory where author established his/her fallacy.
