

# Review of: "The Study of Consciousness Is Mired in Complexities and Difficulties: Can They Be Resolved?"

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The author could strengthen methodological criticism with alternative approaches; offering alternative strategies for how research could proceed would bolster the argument. For example, after suggesting that the NCC project is flawed, he could provide specific suggestions for how neuroscientists or philosophers could approach consciousness differently in their studies.

The article would benefit from specific case studies or practical examples that illustrate how the proposed semantic and methodological issues have concretely impacted research. By including examples of where misunderstandings have hindered progress, the argument could become more relatable and grounded.

Also, the author calls for greater “semantic lucidity” and better operational definitions, but offering concrete examples of what these operational definitions might look like would greatly benefit readers. If he could outline steps or criteria to follow in developing a shared, clear definition of consciousness, it would provide actionable insights for future research.
