The article is generally well written except for the introduction that requires embellishment and polishing.

What is problematic and need extra care is the assumption latent throughout the analysis. I refer here to the assumption that religion and economics (forces of production) are causally related. It appears that this causality is taken for granted while it needs to be established on firm foundations. I see economic activities leading to ecological problems an objective fact divorced of religions (if Christian theology is behind the misuse of natural resources, then what about China or India?). Max Weber's perspective seems to have better explanatory force here where religion is only one factor among others.

I recommend the publication of the article contingent on addressing the above-mentioned points.
