I thought this was a great article. The topic, examining ACEs among emerging adults, was really

interesting, something I haven't seen much of, and important for medical and psychological

professionals. I especially appreciated that you got feedback from participants; that is really

important, especially when talking about a somewhat more sensitive topic.

A few comments... I thought the transition from emerging adulthood to ACEs in the introduction was a

little abrupt and could have flowed better or been organized differently. Possibly sub-headings could

help organize your background on emerging adulthood first, then ACEs, and then connecting the two.

Were the participants identified through a university counseling center? I would make that more clear

if so.

In the discussion, I would add more emphasis on why understanding and assessing for ACEs is

important in care for emerging adults in clinical and community spaces. What recommendations

would you have for providers, professors, and mental health providers working with these

individuals? I think encouraging people to screen for ACEs and to learn more about ACEs themselves

would help improve care.
