Thank you for the opportunity to reviewing a manuscript "Empowering Future Workforces: Reframing Education to Develop Essential Skills for a Dynamic Labor Market".

The manuscript deals with a very topical topic in past pandemic years - the development and application of adaptable educational systems from the point of view of improving the soft-skills of university graduates.

The author specifically focuses on fostering transferable skills - the crucial skills - communication, critical thinking, and problem-solving. I suggest that, from the point of view of improving the quality of the article, the issue of adaptability of current education for the needs of practice should be more detailed in the chapter "Introduction". It is necessary to cite many sources to support the paradigm of an unstable educational environment oriented to adapting to new world conditions and the turbulent labour market.

The chapter "Cultivating a Generation of Problem Solvers" is primarily focused on soft skills in developing the ability to solve problems. The author proposes various procedures and strategies for involving university students in joint activities within hybrid, mixed and online courses. It would also be appropriate to expand this chapter with some examples from educational practice (citations of appropriate sources), case studies or the author's own practical experience.

I perceive the manuscript as the author's reflection on the potential development of education that is friendly to employer requirements. If this consideration should move in a scientific direction, I would recommend expanding the text with more examples in the form of relevant references as well as proposals for specific procedures to improve and stabilize the current state. I wish the author the best of luck in researching such an interesting issue as the soft skills of university graduates certainly is.
