The study sought to evaluate the perceptions and experiences of rights violations by mental health patients. Also, the authors said they used convenience sampling, proportionate sampling, and consecutive sampling. But the sampling technique described is systematic sampling, though not properly described; for instance, the sampling interval was not stated.
