A more explicit methodology section would enhance the study's rigor and credibility.

The study provides some recommendations for adapting university curricula, but the link between these recommendations and the empirical findings is somewhat unclear. A more explicit discussion of the data and its implications on the suggested curriculum adaptations would strengthen the article.

The conclusion provides a concise summary of the main findings but could be more robust in discussing the broader implications of the research. A discussion of the practical applications and potential challenges in implementing the suggested curriculum changes is needed.

In summary, the research article addresses an important issue in Chinese higher education and offers valuable insights. It would benefit from further clarification in the methodology section and a deeper exploration of the practical implications of the proposed curriculum adaptations. I recommend acceptance with revisions, with a focus on improving these aspects to enhance the quality and impact of the research.
