Title and Abstract

- Title of the manuscript is quite lengthy and unclear. Consider making the title more concise and clearer.
- The title mentions "Coronavirus COVID-19," which is redundant.
- The abstract lacks structure. There is no cohesive flow of information.
- In the abstract, few abbreviations are mentioned for the first time without spelling them out. E.g. ACE2
- Redundancy; in the abstract authors repeated certain points multiple times, such as the mention of stress, anxiety, and depression, as well as the impact on various organs.
- The abstract lacks scope and context for the review being conducted.

The Introduction

- This sentence is not clear: "In this century, coronavirus is spreading a severe respiratory disorder in humans and has demolished all researched treatments"
- The objective of the review covers a wide range of topics. The review could benefit from refinement in terms of scope and inclusion of specific questions.
- The authors' objectives stated that they would cover the psychological effects and social impact of COVID-19.
 However, the majority of the review primarily focused on transmission, with limited attention given to psychological effects.
- · Same would apply for the effects on CNS

Main Body

 The review seems to lack organization and clarity. For example, authors might benefit from considering the orders of the paragraphs.



- "The angiotensin-converting enzyme ACE2 plays a role as a receptor for SARS-CoV-2. ACE2 is present in the endothelial linings of all organs, especially the heart, lungs, liver, kidneys....". Redundant information. Authors already mentioned this somewhere else.
- Paragraph 5. Modes of Transmission: authors mentioned 'Human to human transmission was first studied by Chan et al." Please cite the correct reference.

The conclusion

• The conclusion makes general statements without any specific evidence, in addition, authors did not draw any meaningful conclusions.
