Abstract

Conclusion, first line: delirium, EPS, and psychosis are different from each other. Please do not mix them up.

Please note that delirium is a cognitive problem, EPS are adverse effects of drugs, usually antipsychotics, and psychosis is a psychiatric disorder.

Introduction

I feel that the first sentence of the Introduction needs to be modified since one does not normally associate calcium channel blockers (CCBs) with parkinsonism and other extrapyramidal symptoms (EPS). I suggest that the authors mention that EPS are not commonly caused by CCBs.

I think if the authors make the above changes, the manuscript can be accepted for publication.
