Introduction may kindly be elaborated and should reflect on the rationale of the study with in-text references from recent studies.

Aim and objectives of the study may be given separately.

Methodology may kindly be elaborated further and include the type of study, sample size calculation, inclusion and exclusion criteria, and data analysis.

Survey questionnaire may be shared as an annexure or as required by journal guidelines

Results- The author has given the descriptive analysis only; the author may have used statistical tests to find out the significant associations with cross tables. The author may kindly consider this. Descriptions of tables may be written in the paragraph format under the table or may kindly refer to the journal guidelines.

Discussion- may again be written in a running way in paragraph format with evidence from recent studies to support his/her findings. The discussion may be elaborated.

Conclusion – may be specific and crisp and should answer your research question. It should not be a repetition of the results. The author may kindly look into this.

Recommendations may be brief and in line with the aim and objectives of the study.

Both in-text and end references may kindly be cited according to the Vancouver style or journal guidelines. More references from recent studies may be added.
