For example, can Sars-CoV-2 infect other species, if so, does it have the ability to re-transmit from animals to humans, and if not, does it have the potential to develop this ability in the future? If it does not have this potential, can antigens obtained from SARS-CoV-2 infections in animals or from species-specific infections, for instance canine coronavirus, be tested in vaccine studies? Do infections in animals contribute to the formation of passive immunity in humans?

At a time when we were looking for answers to these and similar questions, I thought it was a valuable article in terms of revealing the current situation in animals and opening the door to new questions. I hope it will contribute to both the expansion and diversification of future studies and the development of one health perspective.
