I would like to congratulate the authors on the article. It is an interesting theme, and the review of the literature is adequate for a case report.

Here are some suggestions to improve the text:

- In the section Abstract, first phrase, you should add the word hernia after "internal transmesosigmoid."
- In the section Case Report, the correct blood pressure is 14/9 cm Hg, or 140/90 mm Hg.
- In the section Discussion, I recommend describing if the small bowel loop that was strangulated has signs of ischemia, necrosis, or perforation, and if intestinal resection was performed. Otherwise, it might be an incarcerated hernia, thus the title of the paper must be changed. Figure 3 shows apparently viable small bowel loops, indeed.
