Weaknesses and areas of improvement

- Absence of ethical consideration part. The authors did not discuss the institute's approval. Approval is needed even if the study is retrospective.
- Introduction-relevant facts need to be cited.
- The presence of abbreviations without identification.
- The discussion section needs to interpret the study's results more effectively. It needs depth in analysis.
- The article needs proofreading and grammar correction.

Conclusion

While the study offers valuable insights into the biliary complications following liver transplantation, addressing the identified weaknesses would strengthen the overall impact of the research.
