This topic of research is actual and interesting, however the narrative of the paper reminds more of storytelling rather than scientific paper structure. The text includes a literature review, and all the figures are borrowed from other authors and previously published papers. Commercial disclosures are provided in the paper; with that being said, one should consider this a commercial leaflet, not a scientific paper.

Major concerns:

Conclusions completely do not match the course of the paper, contain citations and a list of references, and can't be considered appropriate for a scientific paper. Conclusions focus mainly on reducing "spending many US\$ trillions on the next pandemic," which is not the scope of scientific research but a commercial matter.

Figure 4: Did the patient try conventional therapy for Herpes Zoster? Only Acyclovir for 7 days? Deontology and ethics concerns arise upon autobiographical medical sketches without proper professional medical care and self-cure. No professional clinical picture assessment and management is provided, which unfortunately can't be considered as proof of treatment results.

Minor comments:

- 1. Specify keywords; in their present form, they are excessive (version 2, even comments were available for version 1 as well).
- 2. Autophagosomal intake needs to be specified, or ambiguous scenarios should be depicted in figure 1.

I would recommend a major revision of the manuscript before acceptance for publication.
