- 1. The second sentence of the abstract is not clear. It is suggested not to cite authors within the summary.
- 2. Second page, fifth line, first word: correct "Epedemic."
- 3. Second page, seventh line: correct the quote—without parentheses, the last name; correct the last name as well—it is Freire, not Friere.
- 4. Second page, tenth line: missing full stop.
- 5. Third page, after the title 3., begin with a capital letter.
- 6. The conceptualization of coping is excessively enumerative; a synthesis is suggested.
- 7. In theories about coping, the evidence presented by the theories is left aside.
- 8. Page 4, penultimate line: correct the word "pedemic."
- 9. Research regarding the evidence for the cited theories is lacking throughout the article.
- 10. The article makes claims without being supported by evidence, rather based on theories and personal appreciations.

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
