I recommend publication of this article after minor corrections to the sentences reproduced below.

- (i) These female migrants are popularly referred to as Kayayei in local Ghanaian parlance are engaged in the business of head load carrying (porterage) to earn a living
- (ii) The majority of the respondents rated themselves as good (51.5%), fair (27.5%) and very good (21%).
- (ii) The data revealed that respondents who did not have multiple sexual partners were 0.450 less likely to use contraceptives as compared to respondents who had multiple sexual partners (OR =0.450; CI=0.060-3.377; P=0.007).
