I commend the authors for addressing an important topic.

The topic suggests the opinion piece focuses on East Africa; however, the background has more emphasis on NHS without more clarity on East Africa. Authors can consider providing a background of the inequities of East Africa health system as a result of "colonization of health" by addressing the multiple facets that perpetuated the inequities. They can guide the readership on the process of "decolonization" through their experiences as they collaborate between the resident doctors in Tanzania and the team of Physicians and students from the UK.

This can be elaborated with clarity within the three main headings the authors have selected: Politics, Changing Clinical Priorities and Practice and Academic challenges remaining within the context of East Africa.

As is, the opinion piece is addressing multiple important topics which are not necessarily a true reflection of the topic and has a stronger focus on the undergoing in the NHS and general issues to do with Africa broadly without much insight on East Africa as per topic.
