

Review of: "A Case Report of Situs Inversus Totalis With Ventricular Septal Defect: Flipped Physiology"

In the manuscript, the Authors present a rare case of VSD in situs inversus. The case is rare and challenging, and the imaging is good.

The presentation is quite superficial since it does not consider several aspects that could be of interest for discussions:

- The real physiological parameters are missing since pulmonary wedge, cardiac output, and Qp/Qs are missing.
- No consideration is made about the reduced ejection fraction... Did you consider coronary artery disease based on the advanced age?
- What was the pharmacological treatment at discharge?
- Why percutaneous closure was not considered as an alternative to surgery after the patient's refusal? Was it excluded for anatomical reasons? Please discuss.
- Existing literature on the topic was not well described. Are there available cases?
