- 1. I suggest going over the introduction "Families...... sanctuary" to review the writing and choice of words to make it clearer.
- 2. Under the section "Stress and Wellbeing in a Post-Migration Context," there is a run-on: "As Alfadhli.... refugee groups." Kindly review this.
- 3. Under the section "The Social Identity Approach and Social Identity Change," there is a run-on: "In Muldoon et al.'s (2019)...post-traumatic growth." Kindly review this.
- 4. Under the section "The Social Identity Approach and Social Identity Change," there is a run-on: "Howevr....impacting wellbeing." Kindly review this.
- 5. Under the section "Semi-Structured Interview Schedule," there is a wrong word: "They were asked where they lived, with whom, and what life was like before the war started." Kindly review this.
- 6. Procedure: "Interviews were carried out between September 2022 and December 2022. All participants were contacted through local Ukrainian support communities, either via face-to-face or via social media appeals to Ukrainian Facebook communities." What about their consent for participation?
- 7. "All names have been changed to maintain anonymity." Kindly review.
- 8. What about the data collected: what happened to it after the study was done? The data will be destroyed by shredding the paper and permanently erasing the digital data.
