Asut et al. conducted a study to evaluate the perceptions and attitudes regarding COVID-19 vaccination and hesitancy among attendants of a healthcare center in Northern Cyprus. This is a well-written study with a detailed methodology. I have a few minor revisions:

- 1. In the abstract, the authors write, "Of the total participants" please state the count.
- 2. In the introduction, the authors write, **Objective**: The current study aims to investigate the vaccine uptake, intention to accept the COVID-19 vaccines, and vaccine hesitancy rates in the society of Northern Cyprus and associated factors." Please state the primary and secondary objectives separately.
- 3. In the results, it would be interesting and more meaningful to employ univariable and multivariable logistic regression models to evaluate the association between attitudes, perceptions, and knowledge regarding COVID-19 and its vaccination with all sociodemographic factors such as education, ethnicity, age, etc.
- 4. In the discussion, please add the limitations of the study.
