I would like to suggest few changes before acceptance:

Establishing a more explicit linkage, possibly through a conceptual model or framework, would strengthen the argument and provide readers with a more precise understanding of the underlying mechanisms.

Diversity of Platforms: To enhance the generalizability of the findings, consider including a more diverse set of multi-sided platforms in your analysis. The current selection may not fully capture the breadth of MSPs operating in different industries or geographic regions.

Empirical Evidence: The paper would be further strengthened by the inclusion of more empirical evidence, particularly case studies or real-world examples that illustrate the successful application of social network strategies by MSPs. This would not only support the theoretical claims but also provide a richer context for the discussion.

Discussion on Limitations: While the paper is well-composed, it would benefit from a more detailed discussion of its limitations. Acknowledging potential biases or constraints in the study's design and data could provide a more balanced view and suggest directions for future research.
