• The abstract doesn't provide sufficient information, the method adopted in the paper, and the main findings are not clear

"The analysis is intended to validate crime prevention and understanding of the present context of a particular urban agglomeration of India." Which type of analysis, what is the method employed? What are the main results concerning the validation of crime prevention in the studied area?

- The literature review is well organized but licks recent studies, the cited sources should be updated and recent studies
  on the subject should be parkoured and integrated.
- In the methodology section, the resolution the Google Maps captures is very poor, providing a better resolution picture will make the idea clearer, therefore the pictures should be numbered sequentially.
- Methodology doesn't provide sufficient information; it should explain the tools and methods clearly and formally in detail. The survey should be explained showing its objectives, the selection of the sample, and its structure. The method of the analysis of the survey's results should be explained in the tools and methods.
- Some information concerning the method is included in the results and discussion section. The latest should contain the results (starting with Figure 2 on page 9) and their discussion section.
- The discussion section is a part of the conclusion, it should be separated, and the conclusion should contain the findings and novelties of the research, and answer or confirm the objectives cited in the introduction.

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
