Review of: "Bridging the Language Divide in UK Paramedic Care: An Atomic Article Reviewing Challenges, Strategies, and Emerging Innovations"

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The authors discuss an important topic that impacts the care of patients with limited English proficiency on initial contact with care during emergencies. It identifies an important problem and highlights the barriers experienced in the field, with suggestions for how to address these barriers to improve communication. It is timely, concise, and addresses an important gap in care for patients. The article could be strengthened by adding patient perspectives with paramedics during emergency calls, as language barriers often limit or delay use, and by addressing some of the potential challenges of implementing digital translation tools in the field.
