The section of results requires more detail variable wise. Validity test for the items used in questionnaire is also missing; cornbach alpha test, without which we cant be in the position to highlight the importance of various instruments specifically upon the dependent variable. There is need to add such type of relevant statistical tests for the authenticity of the questions being used in the analysis.

Overall the study is having originality and can contribute significantly towards the expansion of entrepreneurial culture.
