

## Review of: "Assessment of Urban Health Extension Package Utilization and Healthcare Seeking Behavior among Model and Non-Model Households in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia"

It is a pleasure to get the opportunity to review this manuscript. The authors address one of the pressing issues in grassroots health service delivery mechanisms. Having said this, I will forward the following comments and suggestions in order to have the research article meet the standard of the academic community.

- 1. The level of urban health extension package utilisation between those who are model and non-model households appears very similar (78 vs 64.2). The authors should justify this discrepancy.
- 2. Even if the level of health seeking behaviour is the second outcome, there is no figure indicating these results.
- 3. Why do the authors focus only on households headed by females? This should be elaborated upon since it can be a means of introducing bias.
- 4. In the research setting section, information relevant to the research objectives should be included. For example, health service coverage, hygiene and sanitation services, etc.
- 5. Have you encountered households headed by minors (under 18)? If not, it would be better to modify the eligibility criteria.
- 6. On average, how much time is required to graduate a household as a model? Your eligibility criterion time limit (1 year and above) should take this into account.
- 7. The authors use multi-stage sampling. However, you didn't take any statistical measures to counter losses of variability due to your approach.
- 8. The authors should indicate the minimum level of achievement to declare a household as model. Having this information will have implications for the interpretation of different utilisation levels.
- 9. How did you ascertain appropriate and inappropriate health seeking behaviour? What is the time period to measure health seeking behaviour? How will you categorise if a respondent goes to health facilities and traditional healers within a given period of time?.
- 10. There are variables that need operational definition.
- 11. The content of the tool should be presented in detail. In addition, which member of the household is taken as the respondent, in what setting/context you interviewed, etc., should be narrated.
- 12. The discussion needs further strengthening, including discussion by giving a meaning for the results.
