

Review of: "Solving the naming ambiguity of auditory localization mechanisms: HRTF & HRSL, and ILD, ITD, IPD"

The primary aim of the present manuscript is to address ambiguity in the terminology of several auditory localisation mechanisms. This is an interesting topic, as confusing terminology does impede research and can potentially lead to larger misconceptions between research fields. However, the arguments or examples offered in the manuscript do not convincingly present such ambiguities existing in present auditory science literature.

Additionally, neither definitions presented in the manuscript appear to accurately describe the HRTF. A Head-Related Transfer Function is--by definition--a transfer function, i.e., a mathematical representation of the relationship between the input and output signals.
