Kudos to the Author(s) for coming up with this research! It will definitely contribute to the housing situation in Uganda. However, there is a need to further strengthen the paper based on the following suggestions I have specifically highlighted below:

ABSTRACT: The purpose section of the Abstract is concise, but should be expounded to include key details of the methodology and the major findings of the research. This will add more flesh to it.

LITERATURE REVIEW: The review covers relevant concepts and demonstrates a clear understanding of the topic. However, the "key housing terms" look out of place in there and could be summarized and moved to the Introduction section. This will create more room for the housing situation in Uganda to be thoroughly explored in the literature review section. Additionally, more references can be incorporated from 'individual authors' on housing, as the research tends to focus only on the works of Mukibi (2019) and Biwott (2019).

METHODOLOGY: The author(s) really need to holistically improve this section. Although the qualitative research methodology is mentioned, the reason for adopting this method is not provided. Also, the research population must be stated, as must the sampling technique used, number of respondents interviewed, and the instruments for data analysis along with their criteria and justification. This will give the research a focus, as Uganda is way too wide a study area for feasibility purposes.

RESULTS: This section appears a bit scanty. To make it robust, more insights can be drawn from the findings of the qualitative interviews. This will improve the overall quality of this very interesting research.

N.B: Once these minor observations are addressed, the research can be accepted for publication.
