

Review of: "Determinants of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) Sustainable Development in Africa"

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„Development of MSMEs Sustainable Development in Africa“, reviewed by Miroljub Hadzic PhD, full professor at University Singidunum, Belgrade, Serbia

The topic and the subject of the study is nevertheless very important for sustainable development in Africa, considering that the majority of companies in all countries over the world are MSMEs and also taking into account that they contribute mainly to GDP growth and employment, as well.

One has to bear in mind it is important to cope with the subject of the study, as authors correctly noted, that the research on MSMEs in Africa is still in early stages, so they included results of some of these few studies in the paper.

Previous researches of MSMEs in Africa were oriented to a certain country. However, the paper covers 54 African countries, which gives a universal policy economic approach to the study.

The content of the paper is a classical one, including all necessary elements to give scientific - research character to the study. It includes as follows: introductory part, with definition of the subject of the study, its methodology, hypotheses, review of literature, investigation, discussion and conclusion.

Considering that authors run their own research based on statistical analysis of the questioner received from 450 companies the paper has a character of an original research paper.

Regarding language I didn't find any omission or necessary correction.

Conclusion of the paper is somewhat poor and I have to emphasize a need to be broadened, especially in the field of developing economic policy recommendation to people responsible for establishment and development of so - called eco system encouraging for MSMEs growth and development.

Somewhere there is a possibility to comment some limitations of the study, considering that it is based on the questioner and the statistical analysis of data completed and considering relatively small sample. Also, some basic data related to the stage of MSMEs in Africa could be useful. Otherwise, the paper is somewhat artificial, out of the reality, e.g. broaden environment.

Literature used in this research is very respectable, mentioned, covered and analyzed by authors as the list is very long, respectable and new.
