The title does not match the content of your text. I often read the whole manuscript once or twice to understand the title. Still, I need to get your title aligned with your content.

Your abstract includes recent events, such as the Covid-19 pandemic and the Russia-Ukraine conflict, which have led many people to migrate to Western Europe. I could not find such information in your text. It is just one of the examples that most or all of your abstract information is detached from your main text.

In social science, you should have proper target population(s), research question(s), hypotheses, method(s), and results and conclusions. Literature review and quotations/statements are not a method.

Although there is no firm conclusion, I cited the bottom line of your text: "The arrival of each new life, wherever it is born on earth, shows a profound understanding of life beyond all planning." Again, please contemplate your title, "The Gradual Growth of Man in the Freedom of a Child of God." Two contradictions here: First, males and females are both children of God who have the freedom of their decisions. It means that husbands and wives/partners decide on family planning. Second, I believe everyone on earth cherishes new births or even existing lives, whether family planning or not.
