Also describe the type of questions used in the data collection instrument. Mention how you devised the qualitative questions to be asked? Address the reliability and validity issues of the instrument both quantitative as well as qualitative. State clearly the procedure for data collection. Since this study is inclusive of respondents from three countries findings should mention country wise similarity and differences of their responses. Data can be analyzed using quantitative techniques instead using percentage method. Similarly for analyzing response of qualitative questions, qualitative tools can also be used. Authors also need to incorporate limitations of the study and direction for future researchers.
