Review of: "Potential Mechanisms of Continuity of Care and Future Research"

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1. Need for empirical anchoring

The manuscript proposes mechanisms but does not sufficiently connect them to real-world empirical examples or case studies.

Recommended improvement

Include illustrative examples from healthcare systems where team-based continuity has demonstrated measurable improvements.

Provide evidence linking specific mechanisms (e.g., counseling or care monitoring) to measurable outcomes such as hospitalization reduction or medication adherence.

2. Lack of operational definitions and measurable indicators

Several mechanisms remain abstract and difficult to translate into research or policy.
